Group Treasurer Alan Almond, 18 Alder Drive, Houghton, Preston, would like to remind Lancashire members that the local group subs of 50p. are due for 1979. Please note that for 1979 all local group members must be members of the national TRF. Why is 50p. charged for local member ship? Because we need the money. Local membership will give you a group card, your name in the nembership book and the dubious privilege of getting involved in a local TRF Group.

The Group AGM will be held on the first Tuesday of March at the usual meeting place at 8 pm., all appointments and decisions to become effective on the 1st April. All Committee positions (Rep, Secretary, Row Officer and Treasurer) are up for grabs. If you think you can do a better job than the above or have something to say, this will be the time to do it. Only paid-up members of the Lancs Group are eligible to vote, speak or take up Committee positions, therefore you are advised to get your Group subs to Alan Almond as soon as possible.

Lauric Hopgood foolishly said our meetings sometimes end up with us arguing in circles, so in future he will be acting as Chairman to keep us in order.

On the meeting place - two stalwarts have volunteered to go on a pub crawl around Winchester to find a better place to meet. Now all we need is a Social Secretary to think of something to do with our new super-efficient evening meetings.

### BRIAN THOMPSON'S ROW BIT

Use Forms; For years, many members at the end of every run, often wet and cold, have filled in use forms, and wondered if they are of any value. Rocently Alan Jackson and Geoff Barfoot rang asking if they should continue with these, so here are my views. The standard TRF use form, now nine years old, is not admissable in Court or at Public Enquiries, and the official form from County Hall or me must be used. One form for each witness and covers any period for each lane. The simple TRF forms. are only to let the RoW Officer know who has used which lane so that he may call on County Hall to give evidence. To avoid keeping hundreds of grubby forms that may never be needed, I suggest that the Row Officer for each Group keeps a list of riders to call on or, instead, once a year pass a list of lanes round the clubroom and get riders to indicate those used. For instance, when South Yorkshire Public Enquiries came up last year into Byway claims, County Hall asked for proof of claimed use evidence. I asked six local riders to fill in proper forms and these were sent off. County Hall conceded defeat and we got 22 Byways. Six witnesses are sufficient, especially if over 20 years each.

Angela Rippon's Country Programme on BBC TV on December 1st showed Thames Valley members on the Ridgeway. I thought they behaved perfectly, all on quiet fumeless bikes. Yet the immediate reaction from the panel of experts was all too predictable, with a Hell's Angel taunt and ban 'en call. Angela, to her eternal credit, spoke in our defence. A sad reminder of the sort of built-in prejudice we face.

London Gazette: Another regular worry is how does a County Rep know when his favourite lane is threatened. No worry! A notice of intended closure (i.e. Section 108 in Court or traffic order or Special Review) must be published in the local press and also by law in the London Gazette, which I take and will notify you if anything moves in your area.

Rights of Way Conference: A Future Legislation
Conference is being held in London on January 18th. The
Government plans a new Countryside Bill in this session
of Parliament and the Conference is submitting proposals.
The Government will also take the findings of the green
lane study into account. I will attend to safeguard our
interests. It is known that the RA want to stop up the
loophole shown by Hoffman's legal opinion allowing us
to use downgraded RUPP's.

Yorkshire Dales (Now in Cumbria): George Abbay warns no that the Forestry Cormission are now the landowners on the best track in England! - Great Wold or Craven Way, near Dent. He says they plan to plant trees all over the moor. As the green lane is unclear and about 100-ft. wide, George thinks they may plant trees all over the lane. If any rider sees any such work, please report to me or David Howe. As the FC are known for their disregard of public rights of way, he warns that they may close off the Great Wold, even though it is to be a Pyway.

Lancashire: More reports needed on this second helping: 1. Rawtenstall to Edenfield via 1250' hill. Three wiles long. GR 95/808222 to 800192, it is an OCR, so it is OK for status.

2. Chapel Hill, Rawtenstall to Sagar Holem. GR 95/813231 to 834243, 22-miles long. Footpath status, but thought to have some vehicular rights, badly needs researching. Reported as blocked in two places in 1972. Use at your own risk.

- 3. Deerplay Moor. GR 95/843258 to 859268, two miles long. Was Footpath only, yet is 15-ft. wide and well defined. Like 2, use at your own risk.
- 4. Burnley area. Rose Hill, GR 95/796311 to 818317, two miles long. Was obstructed in 1972. Status Footpath only, use at your own risk! Blocked at New Farm in 1959. Northern fork at New Barn perhaps now impassable?

I will try and find time for some research soon. Lancs are doing a Special Review in 1979, so this is the time to do some work.

Wiltshire: Still no decision yet on the Stephen Russell incident. County Hall want to call and warn the farner. The TRF has paid legal fees of £16. in connection with this case. All part of the service, but strictly for members only. Many trail riders, some of whom ride with the IRF, are too mean to join.

A shortened version of the beautifully turned out minutes of the Annual General Meeting follows - thank you, Bruce.

Reports from TRF Executive Committee Members:

Secretary (Bruce Roberts). His article in the November Bulletin summed up his involvement with the TRF in 1978. Pleased to see the formation of new Groups - Bournemouth, Bristol, Devon & Cornwall, Gloucestershire and West Anglia.

Treasurer (Howard Wadsworth). Current Account balance - £1,436.84. Fighting Fund - £1,000. 1978 expenditure - £1,606.67.

The cost of producing the Bulletin was held down by a 'very cheap' supply of A4 duplicating paper. This supply is now low, so would all members try to obtain some and pass it on to the Editor via their Group Reps.

Membership Secretary (John Higgin). A successful year, with the membership standing at 630 and an estimated total membership of 700 by the end of 1978. Five members are still paying by Standing Order and only the amount of £1. Please would these members cancel these Standing Orders and pay their £3. for 1979.

Mr. Higgin announced his resignation as Membership Sec. and the Fellowship awarded him a vote of thanks for his splendid efforts during the last two years.

Press Officer (Pete Plummer). A busy year with some difficulties in respect of press releases. His responsibilities as Press Officer were those of advising the motorcycle press of matters happening within the TRF and of monitoring articles that appeared in the press. At the conclusion of the Press Officer's report, the Chairman (Seymour Moss) stated that the responsibilities of the P.O. are as stated above and not, as seen by some, to be those of a Public Relations Officer. The TRF has no P.R.O. and relies on its members to perform, individually, a proper P.R.O. job. The Chairman further stated that if individuals write to the Press directly, then they should not sign on behalf of the TRF. All articles signed on behalf of the TRF for national publication must pass through the Press Officer. This does not prohibit a Group from writing to the local press on its own behalf.

Editor (Nick Walker). 11 issues of the Bulletin this year. (Sorry chaps - it was only 10 - Nick.) A big problem in obtaining A4 duplicating paper; he repeated the earlier request made by the Treasurer for members to try to obtain paper and pass it on to the Editor via their Group Rep. A question was posed by Mr. Northeast as to whether it might be possible to include photographs in the Bulletin. The Editor replied that the idea was under consideration.

Rights of Way Officer (Brian Thompson). 1978 was his fourth year as Row Officer for the TRF and his first as Row Agent for the BMF. The holding of both offices by one person was to the benefit of the trail riding fraternity and wrought little conflict. He referred to the difficulty of financing any High Court action and mentioned the lack of support from Heron Suzuki. Support from Andover Norton was gratefully acknowledged, but the TRF requires more assistance (the BMF shares some costs,) Tribute was paid to Mr. Rowley - Honorary Solicitor to the TRF - for his assistance and advice. The requirement for local Groups to perforn Rights of Way work for their own areas was explasised.

The meeting applauded Mr. Thompson for his efforts in 1978.

### Proposals

The meeting voted that the name 'Trail Riders Followship' would remain unchanged.

The proposal that the offices of Press Officer and Secretary be combined as one was rejected.

The proposal - That all people associated with the TRF generally, whether paid up members or not, and the Executive Officers in particular, should actively encourage the public to realise that green lane motor-cycling is for pleasure only and that there is no connection between the TRF and competitive motorcycle sport - was accepted by the meeting. It was reaffirmed to all members that the TRF is a non-competitive organisation.

A proposal that the TRF provide a Family Membership Scheme was voted out - 1 for, 76 against.

A request from the Committee for assistance in co-ordinating the printing of TRF material, including publicity material, was accepted by Mr. Dunsire.

1979 Officers. Any Other Business. Mr. Plummer asked that the TRF officially recognise and approve of the National Trail Riding School. Discussion resulted in the conclusion that the proposal may be considered in depth at the next Committee Meeting.

The principle of holding the AGM in different parts of the country was re-confirmed and a venue of Bristol was suggested for the 1979 AGM.
